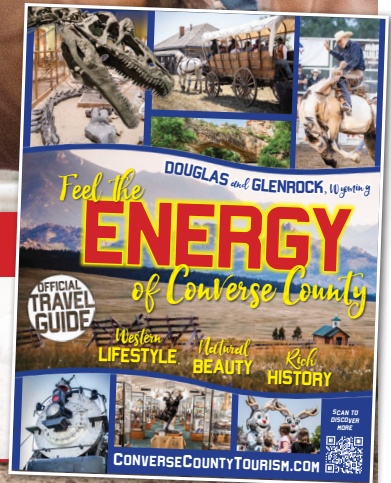


TABLE TENTS

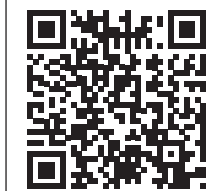

2 Claim & Maintain Your Google Business Listing

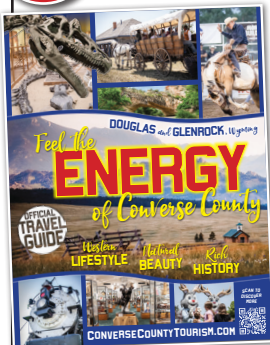
An up-to-date Google listing makes it easier for visitors to find you.
